ANGUILLA AIR AND SEA PORTS AUTHORITY ACT (R.S.A. c. A57)

PIERS DUES REGULATIONS

Note: These Regulations are enabled under section 86 of the Anguilla Air and Sea Ports Authority Act, R.S.A. c. A57.

Interpretation

1. In these Regulations—

“pier” shall have the meaning given to it by the Ports, Harbours and Piers Act;

“shipping place” means the shore or beach extending to a distance of 1 mile on each side of any pier.

Pier dues

2. The following rates shall be charged, paid and collected on all goods and animals imported or exported or landed at or shipped from any pier or shipping place—

Animals—	\$
Asses	4.40 each
Cattle, horses and mules	8.70 each
Calves and foals	2.20 each
Goats, sheep, pigs and other small animals	1.10 each
Bags, barrels, boxes, cases, cans, drums, crates, kegs and similar packages per 100 lbs.25 each
Bricks and cement blocks03 each
Coconuts, husked or unhusked per 10090
Hides and skins30 each
Rope and cordage per 100 lbs.	2.20
Scrap metal per ton	9.00
Wood and timber per 1,000 superficial ft.	18.00
Spars	18.00
Wooden hoops per bundle35
Gravel per ton25
All other articles not specifically exempted, per cu. ft.25

Exemptions

3. Pier dues shall not be chargeable or payable in respect of—

(a) goods and animals going coastwise upon which pier dues have already been paid;

- (b) goods and animals exported or shipped which have been landed in the course of transshipment and upon which pier dues payable on the landing thereof have been paid within 1 year prior to shipment;
- (c) articles for the use of the Government;
- (d) personal baggage of passengers;
- (e) plants;
- (f) poultry not in crates; or
- (g) sand.
